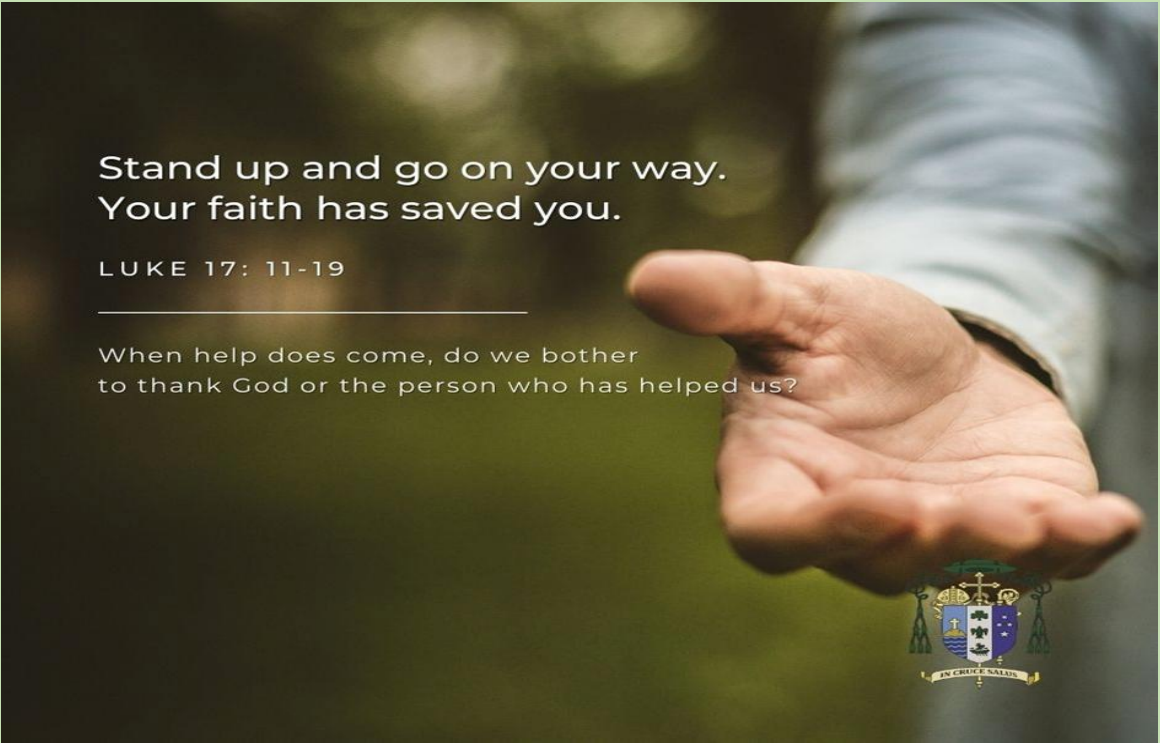

On the way to Jerusalem Jesus travelled along the border between Samaria and Galilee. As he entered one of the villages, ten lepers came to meet him. They stood some way off and called to him, ‘Jesus! Master! Take pity on us.’ When he saw them, he said, ‘Go and show yourselves to the priests.’ Now as they were going away, they were cleansed. Finding himself cured, one of them turned back praising God at the top of his voice and threw himself at the feet of Jesus and thanked him. The man was a Samaritan. This made Jesus say, ‘Were not all ten made clean? The other nine, where are they? It seems that no one has come back to give praise to God, except this foreigner.’ And he said to the man, ‘Stand up and go on your way. Your faith has saved you.’

Their primary concern was to satisfy legal requirements. Only one, a foreigner, though first of thanking Jesus. 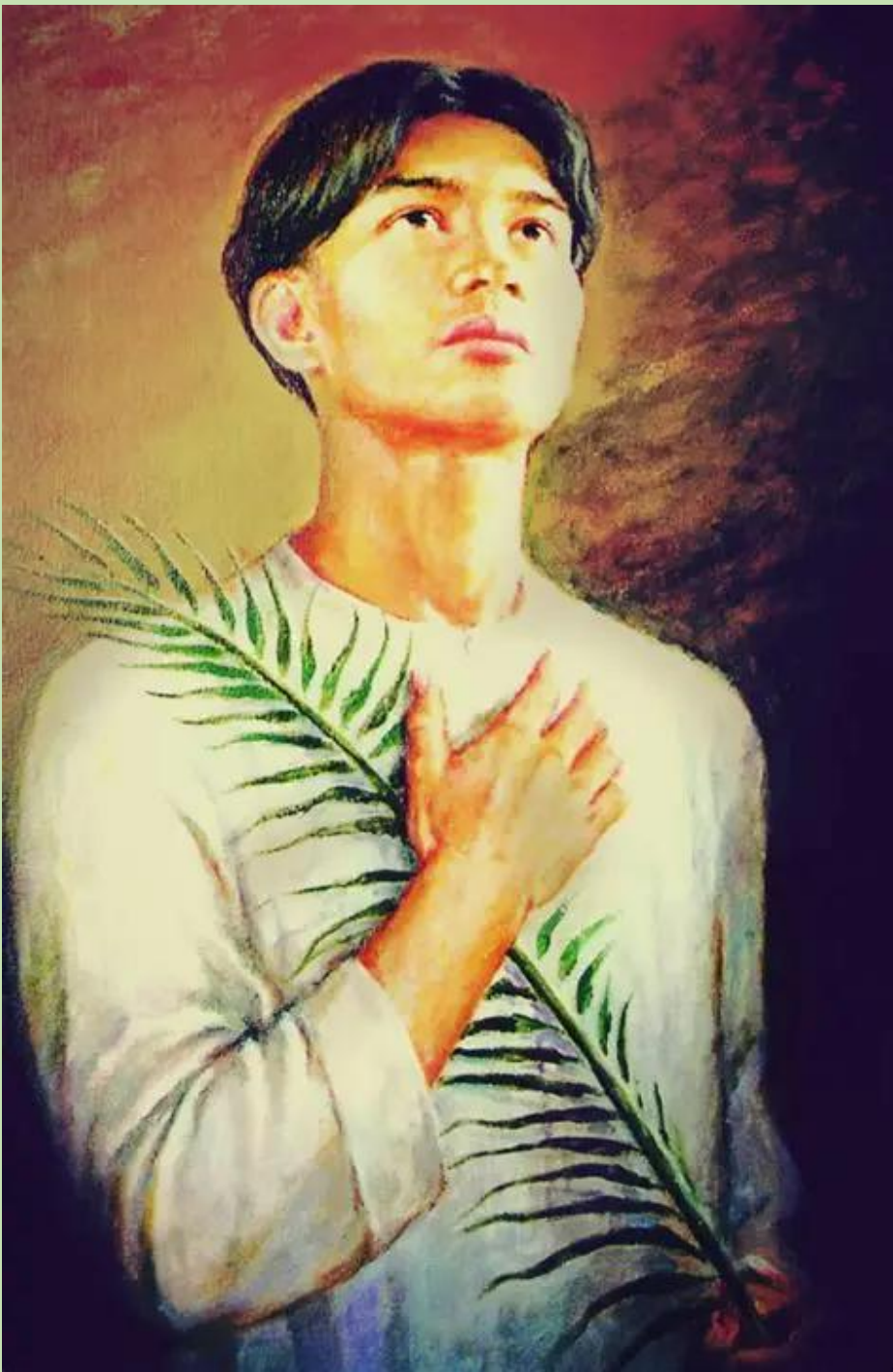

Liturgical inculturation – a dangerous concept?!

The liturgical side of worship is often a reflection of cultural differences and cultural issues and the dynamics of power.

Why does culture play an important role in worship and is yet a devising one? In this context who decides what is acceptable and what is not?

Take as an example the use of a haka in a Mass or the substitution of the prayers of the faithful with a decade of the rosary. How do we deal with these issues when they are culturally relevant but not liturgically relevant or acceptable?

This webinar will deal with the question: when does culture endanger the liturgical community and the church's worship.

Dr Joe Grayland is an assistant lecturer in the Department of Liturgy at the University of Wuerzburg (Germany). He has also been a priest of the Catholic Diocese of Palmerston North for more than 30 years.

PROLIFE: In 1994, Mother Teresa attended a National Prayer Breakfast in Washington, and shared a pro - life message:
“... if we accept that the mother can kill even her own child, how can we tell other people not to kill one another? How do we persuade a woman not to have an abortion? As always, we must persuade her with love. And we remind ourselves that love needs to be willing to give until it hurts. Jesus gave even his life to love us, so the mother who is thinking of abortion should be helped to love -- that is, to give until it hurts, her plans, her free time, to respect the life of a child, for the child is the greatest gift of God to the family, because it has been created to love and to be loved. The father of that child, however, must also give until it hurts. By abortion, the mother does not learn to love, but kills even her own child to solve her problem. And by abortion, the father is taught that he does not have to take any responsibility at all for the child he has brought into that world. So that father is likely to put other women into the same trouble. So abortion just leads to more abortion.” “Any country that accepts abortion is not teaching its people to love one another but to use any violence to get what they want.
